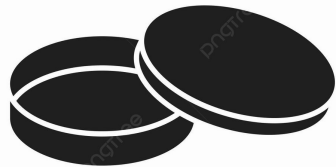

# What is PostgreSQL?

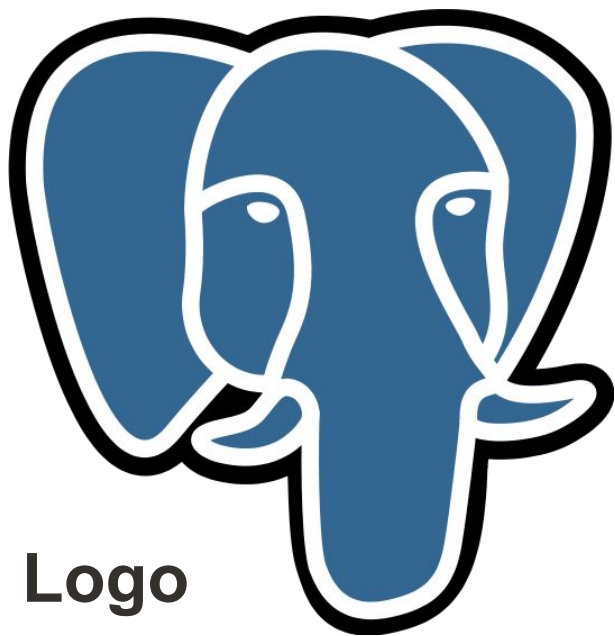

# Connecting

## Coping tactics

1. **Listen**
2. Get out there and **practice**
3. Force your attention **outward**
4. Ask people **questions**
5. Build strong **one on one** relationships (SMART goals)
6. Have an **exit strategy**
7. **Pockets** of time
8. Prepare **talking points**
9. Fake it until you become it. Try **power posing**.
10. Change your state of mind: **asking for favours => sharing your gifts**

# Tips to remember

1. Offline dynamics boosts online dynamics and vice versa
2. Listen and learn the lingo
3. Take a break, breathe, step back, drink water, take a walk and then come back
4. Ask for help

Remember: we all have the same goal - we want to make Postgres better!

- Build fewer, but stronger connections

# Key challenges

- Need for more **contributors**
- Help needed with **less popular tasks** (e.g., patch review)
- Need to revisit and modernize existing **processes**
- Need for **more young people** to get involved in the project
- Support with **legal and financial work**
- Raising **local awareness** about PostgreSQL (e.g., more PUGs)
- Raising **awareness among broader developer communities**
